Sponsor Statement

St. Aloysius, as the sponsor of this school, is legally mandated to provide oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance. As part of the monitoring process, the performance of the school on each of the required Ohio School Report Card components is assessed and evaluated. 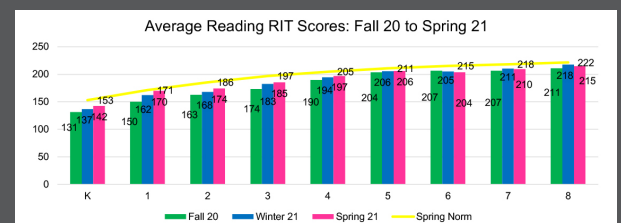
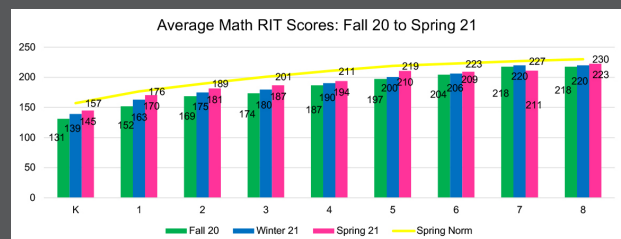
Academic Goals

Our goal is to decrease teacher turnover and increase student achievement by one proficiency level, as measured by MAP RIT score growth.

50% of students will score proficient or better on the ELA and Math state assessments or will demonstrate at least 1.5 years of growth annually on the NWEA Map test for ELA and Math. 50% of K-2 students will move to on-track status on the NWEA Map test for Reading and Math.

The school will create and maintain a comprehensive plan for engaging, students, parents and community partners resulting in an overall attendance percentage of 93% and a decrease in suspensions by 10% and office referrals by 20%.
